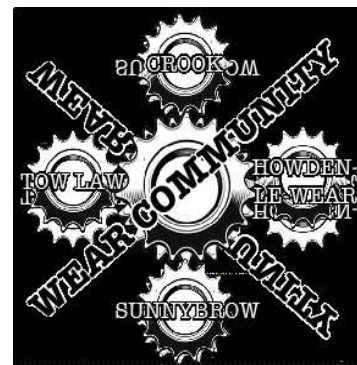

Last summer Tow Law became part of a two year pilot project aimed at reducing alcohol harm called '**Wear Community**' along with Crook, Howden Le Wear and Sunnybrow. Baroness Newlove has started this initiative to see, if given the chance, what communities can do to make improvements around alcohol issues. Baroness Newlove is keen that communities feel they can identify their own problems and more importantly have their say in prioritising ways to tackle these local issues.

From the budget allocated, 40% is to be spent on participation from within the community. Funding for participation and its outcomes will increase next year. We are seeking ideas from our local community on how we can begin reducing alcohol harm and invite everyone to be part of the pilot.

If you would like to put forward any ideas or positive alternatives for the reduction of alcohol harm i.e. **Things to do and Places to go, Training Events, Action Groups** or something completely different!
