Bidding for Quality Town Council Status

Gaining Quality Town Council Status enables councils to work closely with others in the delivery of local services; to better represent their local communities; to solve certain local issues without recourse to the district or the county council and to provide a local information access point.

Examples of the range of services that might be delegated to the town council include:

Street cleaning; maintenance of highway verges, pavements and footpaths; litter collection and control; street lighting; street naming; parking restrictions; issue of bus passes; road safety measures; noise and nuisance abatement; tree preservation orders and the management of libraries.

In order to achieve quality status a council has to satisfy certain criteria to show that it is:

Representative of the whole community

Communicates with its residents

Properly managed and responsible

The town council has registered with the county Durham Association of Local Councils and is preparing the portfolio and application form. Further information will be included in the next edition of the Tattler.



YOUR COMMUNITY NEEDS YOU


Unlike District Councils, Parish Councils are set to continue. The Town Council elections will take place on the same day as the District Council elections on Thursday May 3rd. The Town Council needs people from the community to stand for election to the Council to replace Councillors who are retiring and to bring some new blood to the council. Are you interested in your Town and want to see changes then apply for election. Forms must be completed and returned to Wear Valley District Council by 12 noon on Wednesday 4th April. Nomination forms are available form the Town Clerk who is at the Community Centre every afternoon between 1-4 Monday to Thursday or from Wear Valley District Council Civic Centre Crook.

MILLENNIUM GREEN NEWS

The Trustees of the green have made a formal request to the Town Council to take over the trusteeship of the Trust and to manage and maintain the green. The Trustees as individuals are finding it extremely difficult to continue to manage the green without ongoing resources to do so whereas the Town Council can manage it as part of its responsibilities and is able to raise funds to do so. It would also mean that the Town Council could look at establishing a play area for the town on the green in line with the conclusions of the Recreational Feasibility study that was completed last year. If you feel this is an appropriate way forward contact your Town Councillors and tell them so.

The Festival on the Green on 1st July is continuing to be organised subject to funding being available to pay for the attractions and we hope that it will be as well attended as in the past. We also have a funding bid with H J Banks community fund to pay for some lighting on the green but whether it is put in will depend on whether the green is taken over by the Town Council as the trustees do not have the resources to pay for the running costs.

Just a reminder that the Drop-In sessions are continuing at the Centre throughout the Easter break open to any adults interested in learning how to use a computer, developing new skills such as word processing, spreadsheets, presentations, etc or those who wish to learn how to use the Internet e.g. how to e-mail, how to shop on line, etc and it's all for free.

The times of sessions are every Monday and Wednesday, 10.00 - 12.00 p.m, and 1.00 - 3.00 p.m; plus Tuesday afternoons (with crèche) 12.30 -2.30 p.m.

In addition, these sessions are a must for anyone who wishes to access any of the Learn Direct courses and work towards a gualification. This can be done totally online either at home or at the Community Centre. There are courses in Literacy and Numeracy (you can update your qualifications to Level 2 for free!), Computing, Digital Photography, Business and Management. Again, there is no cost for doing any of this!

In addition, those of you who wish to take qualifications in computing, numeracy and literacy, languages or whatever, can now do so entirely at the Community Centre. We will be able to register you with a course or courses from Learn Direct at the Centre, you will be able to receive tuition at the Centre and you can even take any tests that will give you a qualification at the Centre. The training, registration and courses in numeracy and literacy are all free. Some of the courses may carry a small charge but in some cases, there may be financial help available.

In addition, once you have taken out a registration, all of your learning can be conducted at the Centre or even at home, particularly if you have broadband access.

Funding is also available for crèches, so if you need childcare, then let us know in advance.
