






# Teen Club Mondays 7 till 9 Come along and join in!!

How we treat our bodies from day to day affects how we feel.

The Pilates method is not just a series of exercises, but a complete approach to developing physical awareness in day to day life. It is designed to improve and change the body's postural and alignment habits and is also specifically designed to be carried out in a confined space.

#### What is Pilates?

Pilates is a series of gentle controlled movements that target core muscles deep inside. Core muscles are the muscles round your trunk, your abdominals, and those round your lower back, pelvis and hips. Pilates and general training of these core muscles helps to create a flatter-looking stomach and an improved posture. It also helps to prevent and alleviate back pain. Pilates itself is a series of exercises that uses your own body as resistance in order to create or improve muscle tone. And you're using your deep abdominal muscles so that your stomach looks flatter even when you haven't lost weight.

#### Who should do Pilates?

The Pilates method is beneficial for everyone. As all our bodies are unique the benefits we achieve will differ. Pilates is beneficial for:

- General fitness and body awareness
- Prevention of injury
- Remedial and rehabilitation work
- Ante and post natal fitness in pregnancy
- Fitness for the elderly and children over 12 years old
- Strengthens the pelvic floor
- Longer leaner muscles
- Lose inches
- Improved flexibility & suppleness
- Improve posture & balance
- Strengthen the body and back

Pilates is a lifetime exercise, everyone can join it. It can be done either standing, sitting or lying down so those who are less agile can participate too! Pilates assists in increasing and creating a balance between strength and flexibility. It creates an awareness of and strengthening of core stability. Not only does Pilates significantly improve coordination and posture, but it also helps in releasing stress.

#### CALM IT!

The Town Council is conscious of the disguiet in the community caused by continuing instances of Anti-Social behaviour, despite Police presence increasing and appearance of the community street wardens who are now in post. The proposed public meeting with the Police and the constituency M.P. has not materialised because of a number of factors, but Police have been invited to come along to such a meeting proposed for early January. The meeting will be held on a Friday evening, when the Community Centre is not used, and when the M.P. is more likely to be able to be present. At this stage a definite date has not be agreed, but the meeting will be widely advertised in the community.

## SPORT FOR ALL

The recreation centre will soon be back in use. Thanks to the efforts of the Community Partnership, to the enthusiasm of a dedicated band of helpers, and to money provided by Wear Valley District Council through its Section 106 fund, the equipment used in the Summer by the Wellness on Wheels project in the community centre car park, will be accessible to all members of the community. This will form the first stage of the revitalisation of the recreation area, and will be followed by a revamp of the multi-use games area, the refurbishment of the indoor facilities, and a overhaul of the grass football field which has long been plagued by drainage problems. The new look centre will provide long awaited recreation facilities, and will offer much needed opportunities, especially for the young people of the community.
