Facilities such as youth shelters and skate boards are only two ideas which spring to mind, and a survey to canvass the youngsters' views is being

considered.

West Durham Wind Farm

H.J.Banks & Co. has now submitted its revised plans for a new development of 13 turbines on land at South Shields, West Carr and Stonefoot Hill Farms. The original plan was for 22 turbines, but following a series of public consultation exercises and exhibitions, this has been revised. A copy of the plan is available for inspection in the Community Centre.

NEW LIFE FOR CATTLE MART

The Town Council has been pleased to support the application by Alexander Homes for a mixed housing

development on the Cattle Mart site. The application is now before planners at Wear Valley District Council, and the Town Council feels that it will provide a great boost to the

environmental and economic regeneration of the town. The auction ring itself, which is

a Grade11 listed building will have to be retained, but it will be screened on three sides, with the other side, facing High Street, being landscaped and public seating provided.




