# **UK Online User Journey**

A new type of session is available from the beginning of September for absolute beginners in Computing. The idea of these sessions will be enable people to become confident in the use of a computer, not only in the basic use of it but also exploring the Internet with skills such as e-mails, and online services such as shopping, using public services, job hunting and banking plus digital photography will all be included. This is not a course as such but a steady progression through your interests; you will only access what you want to learn. Drop-In sessions are available at Tow Law Community Centre open to any adults and it's all for free.

### The times of sessions are:

Every Monday and Wednesday, 10.00 - 12.00 p.m, and 1.00 - 3.00 p.m; In addition, these sessions are a must for anyone who wishes to access any of the Learn Direct courses and work towards a qualification. This can be done totally online either at home or at the Community Centre. There are courses in Literacy and Numeracy (you can update your qualifications to Level 2 for free!), Computing, Digital Photography, Business and Management. Again, there is no cost for doing any of this!

In addition, those of you who wish to take qualifications in computing, numeracy and literacy, languages or whatever, can now do so **entirely** at the Community Centre. We will be able to register you with a course or courses from Learn Direct at the Centre, you will be able to receive tuition at the Centre and you can even take any tests that will give you a qualification at the **Centre.** The training, registration and courses in numeracy and literacy are all free. Some of the courses may carry a small charae but in some cases, there may be financial help available. In addition, once you have taken out a registration, all of your learning can be conducted at the Centre or even at home, particularly if you have broadband access.
